Temporary Permit: The Board may issue a temporary practice permit to a military-trained applicant or military spouse licensed in another jurisdiction while the military-trained applicant or military spouse is satisfying these requirements if that jurisdiction has licensure standards substantially equivalent to the standards for licensure of the Board. The military-trained applicant or military spouse may practice under the temporary permit until a license is granted or until a notice to deny a license is issued in accordance with rules adopted by the Board.

Allopathic, Osteopathic and Podiatric Practitioners

- License by Reciprocity: The Board of Medical Licensure is authorized to issue a license to a military spouse to allow the military spouse to lawfully practice medicine in Mississippi if the applicant meets the following requirements.

30 Code Miss. R. Pt. 2605, R. 4.1

- 1. Complete an application for medical license and submit it to the Board in the manner prescribed by the Board with a recent passport type photograph.
- Submit certification of a current license from another jurisdiction, in which that jurisdiction's requirements for licensure are substantially equivalent to or exceed the requirements for licensure of the Board.
- 3. Submit verification that at least two of the past five years preceding the date of submission of the application applicant has engaged in the active practice of medicine.
- 4. Submit certification that applicant has not committed any act in any jurisdiction that would have constituted grounds for refusal, suspension or revocation of a license to practice medicine in Mississippi at the time the act was committed. Applicant may participate in the Board's routine fingerprint background check, at the applicant's expense, in lieu of certification.
- 5. Submit verification that applicant is in good standing and has not been disciplined by the agency that had jurisdiction to issue the license.
- 6. Submit licensure fee prescribed by the Board.
- Submit fingerprints for state and national criminal history background checks.

All Relevant Experience Counts: All relevant experience of a military service member in the discharge of official duties or, for a military spouse, all relevant experience, including full-time and part-time experience, regardless of whether in a paid or volunteer capacity, shall be credited in the calculation of years of practice in the practice of medicine as required under subsection A or B of this section.
